Sleeping at a friend's - Intercultural awareness and understanding

ACTIVITY 2: PLAY LIKE ME, PLAY LIKE YOU

Objectives/ aims of activity (children will be able to):

- Recognize that games are played by children all over the world, sometimes in different ways
- Develop curiosity and respect for cultural diversity through shared play experiences

Activity steps

- 1) Olivia likes playing knights, riding her horse on a stick, and carrying her sword. The teacher asks the children what games they think Bobba might like to play. Their answers can be drawn on a big paper or the blackboard (wall of games).
- 2) The teacher invites children to share what games they like to play at home or with their families. The list of games is completed by the teacher. The children take turns introducing their favourite games to the class (e.g. Who taught you this game? Where do people play this game? Why do you like this game?). Children explain how to play, and everyone joins in.
- 3) To go beyond the classroom, the teacher introduces 2-3 simple games from different countries using visuals and props. Stations can be set up, or the games can be played one at a time as a group.
